September to February, but most start from November each year. We have requested that signs are erected to indicate shooting in that area.

CCTV

Some nearby villages have installed CCTV cameras as a crime prevention measure. This has been explored by the Council as an option for Gateforth. To provide proper coverage in the village would be expensive due to the numbers of roads that would need to be covered, and at the moment it is felt to be not cost effective in what is a low crime area. The Police have advised that individual CCTV cameras are likely to be a better option.

New dog waste bins

Dog fouling continues to be an issue. To assist responsible dog owners the Parish Council has ordered 2 new dog waste bins, one in Hillam Road and one on Landing Road. This will mean that the village has a good coverage of dog waste bins, which gives every opportunity for all dog owners to dispose of their pet's waste.
